

3. Following the Implementation Plan, Respondent Rosauers conducted and completed a computer search and a review of claims and files based on computer codes intended to find occupational disease claims within the parameters of the Schmill decision, the computer search generated 12 claims, and an individual search was made of each of these claims, and none of them met the criteria in Schmill;
4. Following the Implementation Plan, Respondent F.H. Stoltze Land & Lumber Company conducted and completed a computer search and a review of claims and files based on computer codes intended to find occupational disease claims within the parameters of the Schmill decision, the computer search generated 3 claims, and an individual search was made of each of these claims, and none of them met the criteria in Schmill;
5. Respondents NorthWestern Energy, Rosauers, and F.H. Stoltze Land and Lumber Company are desirous of being dismissed from this litigation with prejudice; and
6. Laurie Wallace and common fund Petitioner are agreeable to dismissing said Respondents from this litigation with prejudice.
